

Outline of the route

This walk follows a linear route through woods and fields. It starts* by Webster Lane Farm, where there's roadside parking (access via a cattle grid or PG from the bypass).

*It can also be easily walked to from the village via Webster Lane.

To start, walk towards **Tunstall Woods** down a poolside track, and upon entering them keep to the track down their left hand side—the **woods are private property**.

At the end of the first block of woodland the track curves left, then right and comes to an end by a field on the right. However the path continues and it is in this area, where the woodland becomes a bit more mixed/open, that you can see, usually in May, a good display of natural **Bluebells**, as well as other **Woodland Flowers**.

At point 'A' on the map you can return the way you came or walk on towards Tunstall Farm.

To continue, cross a ST and, keeping woodland on your left, walk down the field. Where the woodland ends continue walking downhill, passing 2 electricity poles on your left (located in the next field), to reach the bottom of the field, then look for a BR over a small stream.

Cross this BR and a FG on the other side to gain access to a pretty grazing meadow. Walk diagonally left across this meadow towards an oak tree by Tunstall Farm. The path then turns right, past the rear of farm buildings, to officially end* by a FG joining the farm's driveway.

* **Important:** There is no right of access beyond this point, so you now need to return the way you came.




